General objective of the Workshop

The Workshop " *Working together for a sustainable use, profitable and safe fishery of the spiny lobster in Honduras* " had several objectives:

1. **Create a space for reflection and analysis among those involved in the field of the lobster fishery in Honduras**
2. **Strengthen existing communication networks, to identify synergies and promote new partnerships.**
3. **Innovation strategies and identify guidelines for action plans in the future.**
4. **Commit to concrete actions in the short, medium and long term towards common goals.**

The workshop aimed to gather very diverse interests and perspectives of the entire system and people that could commit to undertake concrete actions for the sustainable, profitable and safe system of the spiny lobster in Honduras.

To achieve the objectives of the workshop those principles were followed:

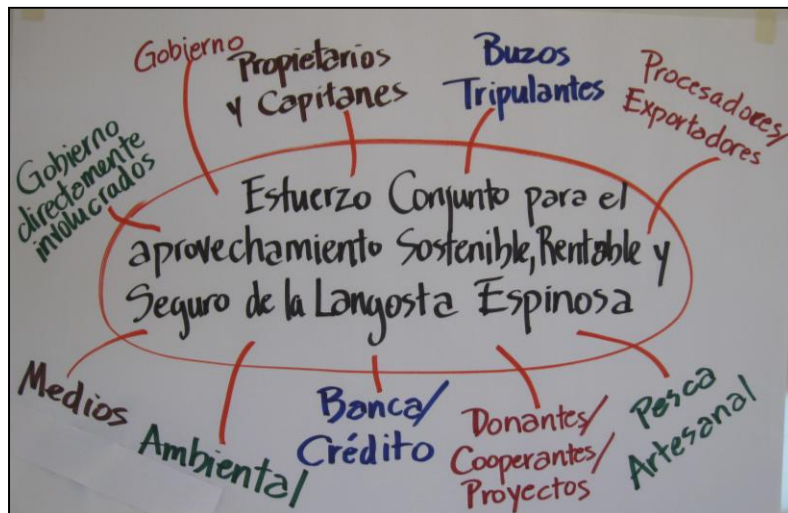
- The entire system join the workshop the whole time (three days) the workshop.

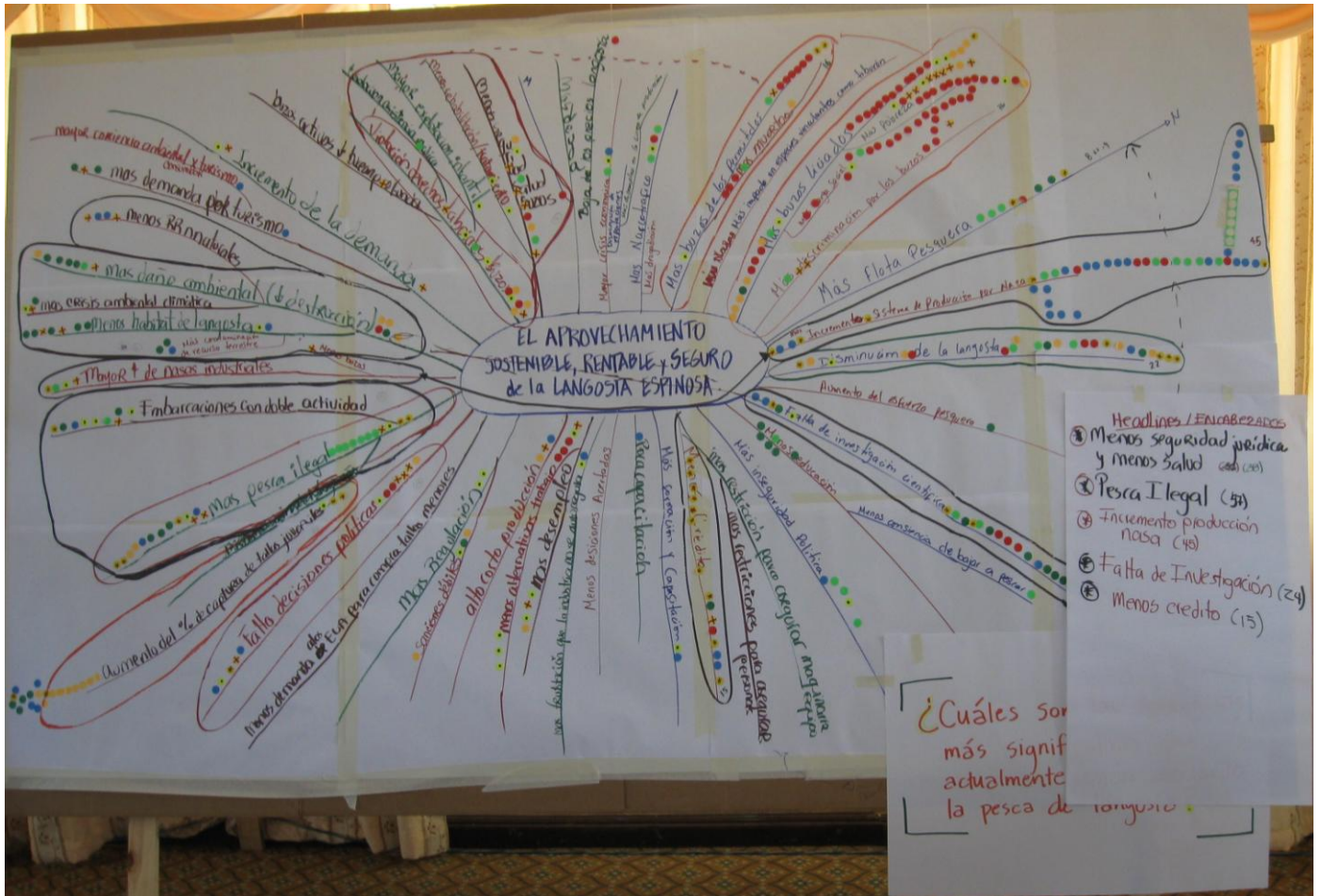
